
NEW DIRECTOR FOR DEKALB

On September 10th, 2022 Northeastern Center and New Hope Clubhouse held the 10th Annual Stomp Out the Stigma 5K run/walk at Bixler Lake Park in Kendallville, IN. Over 150 people, including community members, Northeastern Center staff, Clubhouse members and their families came together to participate and raise awareness for those battling mental illness.

To celebrate the 10th year of the event, medals were given to all participants in the event with special awards going to the 1st place male and female finishers. The first place female finisher was Joanna Carpenter with a time of 21:15, the first place male finisher was Jose Reyes with a time of 22:30.

More than 35 area organizations helped to sponsor this year's event, including: Angola American Legion Past #31 and Alum-Elec Structures.

The Stomp Out the Stigma 5k was started to help increase awareness surrounding mental illness in our communities. Since the start of the event 10 years ago, funds raised from the event have helped to assist New Hope Clubhouse in furthering the employment and educational services offered at Clubhouse.


